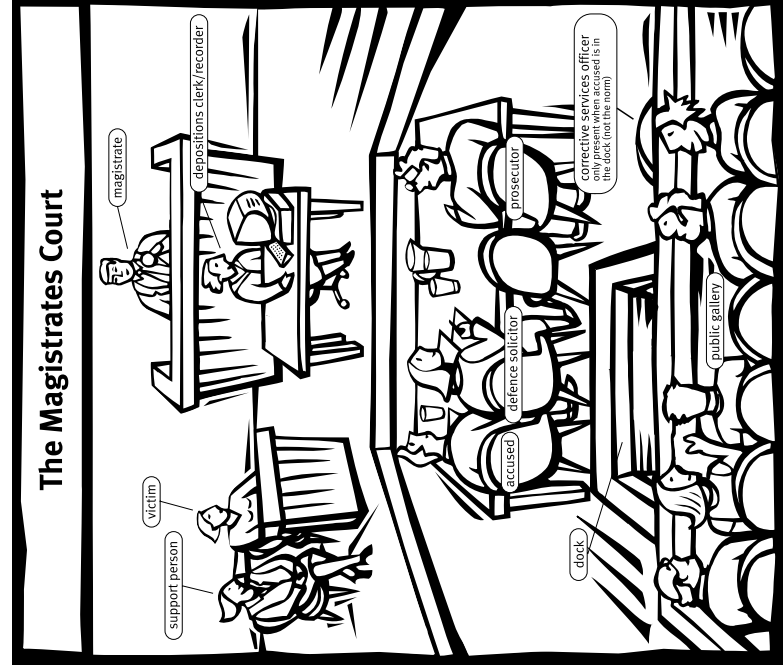
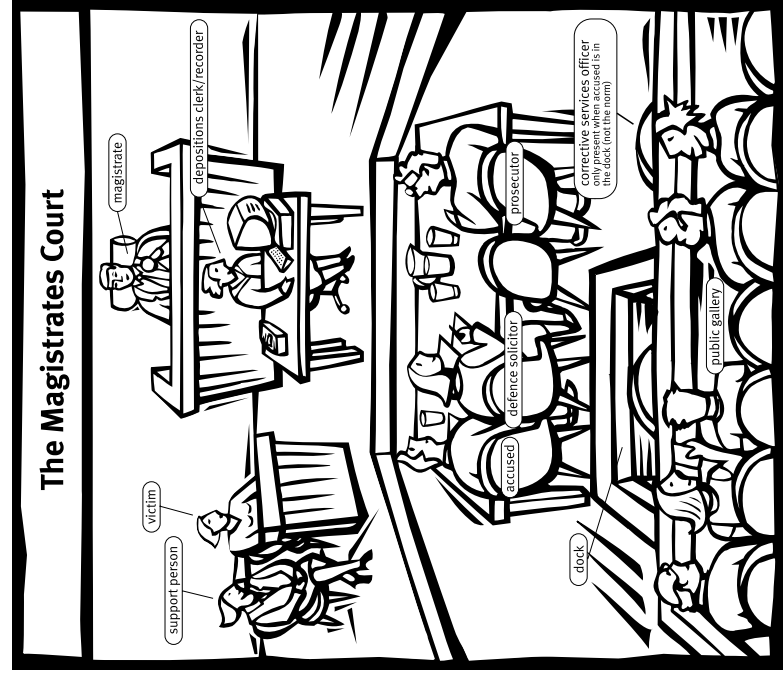
Spot the difference



The District Court or Supreme Court

Look closely and you will find five differences between these two scenes of a Higher Court in action. The District Court is the “next step up” from the Magistrates Court and deals with the more serious cases as well as some appeals. The Supreme Court is the highest court in Queensland and hears the most serious cases. It is the final appeal court in Queensland.

Differences: Judge’s microphone, Court Reporter, Bailiff’s notepad, book beside Defence Counsel, person in Public Gallery.



The Magistrates Court

See if you can spot five differences in these two scenes from the Magistrates Court, the first level in our courts system. All criminal cases are heard here first. There is no jury in this court and the magistrate makes all the decisions. One such decision is whether the person has to face trial.

Differences: Magistrate’s chair, recorder beside Depositions Clerk/Recorder, glass on table, chair in the Dock, book in lady’s hand in Public Gallery.
