Please find below my public submission.

Political Donations:

- Political donations should continue to be capped in Queensland, but the cap should apply to all donations and not just those intended to be used for campaign purposes.
- Ban political donations from all tobacco companies.

Truth in political advertising:

• Truth in political advertising legislation should be introduced in Queensland, and it should extend beyond advertisements to other inaccurate and misleading statements.

How to Vote Cards:

- Introduce a requirement for how-to-vote cards to be published on ECQ website. Postal voters don't get to see them otherwise.
- The ECQ should have the power to refuse to register a how-to-vote card that is likely to mislead or deceive a voter in casting their vote.
- How-to-vote cards should be banned completely.
- In the event How to Vote Cards are not banned then the behaviour of workers who hand out how-to-vote cards should be regulated.

Proof of Identity:

• Voters should be required to produce proof of their identity on polling day. This will decrease electoral fraud.

Enrolment on polling day:

• Voters should be permitted to enrol on polling day.

Electronic voting:

• Electronically assisted voting should be introduced for all voters in Queensland.

Postal voting:

- The grounds upon which a person can apply for a postal vote should be expanded.
- Online postal vote applications should be permitted to make it far easier for people.
- The deadline for lodging a postal vote application should be brought forward by one day

Compulsory voting:

• Compulsory voting should remain for Queensland State elections. This is the best way to accurately determine the "will of the electorate".

Any other matter:

- Queensland must adopt a Proportional voting system such as currently used in Tasmania and the ACT. The current system allows a party to obtain more seats than the % of votes they receive - this is wrong. If a party wins 20% of the vote - they should hold 20% of the seats.
- Introduce electronically assisted voting for all voters in Queensland remote access to allow all Queenslanders to complete the vote from their loungeroom using their own personal computer
