



Call for expressions of interest
Adjudicator, Brisbane
Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal

The Honourable Jarrod Bleijie MP, Attorney-General and Minister for Justice, seeks expressions of interest for appointment as an Adjudicator of the Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal (QCAT) to be located at Brisbane.

QCAT is an independent statutory body established under the *Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal Act* from 1 December 2009.

Adjudicators are responsible for hearing minor civil disputes and other less complex or non-contentious matters before the tribunal as determined appropriately by the President.

Adjudicators hold office for a period of at least 3 but not more than 5 years and are appointed by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Attorney-General.

An applicant is eligible for appointment only if the person is an Australian Lawyer of at least 5 years standing. Qualifications in alternative dispute resolution are highly desirable.
