Re: Respect at Work and Other Matters Amendment Bill 2024

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Respect at Work and Other Matters Amendment Bill 2024 (the Bill).

As you would be aware, as Public Advocate I undertake systemic advocacy to promote and protect the rights and interests of Queensland adults with impaired decision-making ability.¹

I note that this Bill represents the first stage of reforms to the Anti-Discrimination Act 1991. There has been extensive consultation regarding reforms to the Anti-Discrimination Act 1991 including, from earlier this year, a draft Anti-Discrimination Bill 2024 that was proposed to replace the current Act.

I further note that the Respect at Work and Other Matters Amendment Bill 2024 implements some of the changes proposed during the consultation process mentioned above. As can be seen in my support of the development of the draft Anti-Discrimination Bill 2024, I support the updating of antidiscrimination laws to reflect the changing needs of society, including for people with impaired decision-making ability.

I look forward to the further stages of reforms to the Anti-Discrimination Act 1991 that implement the changes seen in the draft Anti-Discrimination Bill 2024.
